How to Get Something Out of Mass

WHY IS MASS SO BORING? There are several reasons we find it difficult to find meaning in the Mass. Sometimes, we forget that the reason we attend Mass not to sit back and like movie critics and to find fault; it is a place to encounter Jesus Christ. We attend Mass to ‘visit’ with Jesus.

Sometimes we are preoccupied with our treasures, a person, or ourselves. That is because we have not yet realized yet that at the root of whatever our heart desires is communion with God. There is a point in every Mass at which we bring our desires to God. But because many of us do not see the connection (or opportunity), we miss it.

Finally, there are those who never set foot inside a church. So, how can Mass be boring if you never go to church. Well, the answer is because the Mass is thought to be boring is the reason, they never set foot inside a church.

Anything we have no interest in will become boring to us. Anything that distracts us from those things we are interested in will become boring to us. Anything we have to make an effort to learn will eventually become boring to us – especially if it is something we can’t easily see a need to learn.
