Part of the Mass Description

- A. We pray for the needs of the Church and the world (also called the Prayer of the Faithful).
- B. The bread and wine are brought to the altar, and contributions to the church and for the poor are collected from those assembled.
- C. A song that is sung in response to the first reading.
- D. After the Gospel reading, the priest or deacon gives a teaching about the Scriptures and encouragement to the people to put God's word into practice.
- E. Opening prayer
- F. This prayer, spoken or sung by the people during the Eucharistic Prayer, is a remembrance of Jesus' death, Resurrection, and promise of his return.
- G. The summit of the celebration -- with the words of consecration Christ becomes sacramentally present under the appearances of bread and wine.
- H. This is from one of the New Testament epistles.
- I. Hymn/Song of praise to God
- J. Part of the Concluding Rites that precedes the Dismissal
- K. This section of the Mass includes the Preparation of the Gifts, the Lord's Prayer, the Fraction Rite, and Communion.
- L. We say the words of the Nicene Creed, which begins, "I believe in one God."
- M. The priest begins this with the words, "Lord Jesus Christ, you said to your apostles: I leave you peace, my peace I give to you."
- N. This follows the "Glory to God" prayer and includes readings from the Scripture.
- O. When we receive the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ.
- P. This comes from the Old Testament, the Acts of the Apostles, or Revelation.
- Q. The people gather, and the priest, ministers and altar servers move toward the altar. This time is often celebrated with a song.
- R. The "breaking of the bread" as the congregation sings or recites the "Lamb of God"
- S. The assembly offers a prayer to confess our sins and ask the Lord's mercy.
- T. The priest begins the Mass by leading us "In the name of the Father..."
